LAS-ICMSF BY-LAWS

(unanimously approved by the LAS members on May 08, 2024)

The Latin American Subcommission (LAS) of the International Commission on Microbiological Specifications for Foods (ICMSF) is a non-profit organization, associated to ICMSF as per section 10 of the ICMSF By-laws (published on www.icmsf.org).

1. Objectives of LAS

- 1.1. To interact with ICMSF on activities and publications by LAS and ICMSF on microbiological food safety and quality, sustainability of food production and the resilience of the food supply chain.
- 1.2. To contribute to the development and dissemination of activities and publications in the areas in scope in Latin American and Caribbean countries.
- 1.3. To develop scientific events and programs in the areas in scope to promote and progress expertise and practices, in cooperation with ICMSF and other scientific organizations.

2. Members of LAS

- 2.1. The LAS is made up of Latin American and Caribbean professionals who work in the region in one or more of the areas related to the objectives of the LAS.
- 2.2. The LAS is made up of the following classes of membership: regular member, honorary member and candidate member. At least one regular member of LAS must be a regular member of the ICMSF.
- 2.3. Regular and honorary members of the LAS can propose candidate members to the LAS. Proposals must be accompanied by the curriculum-vitae of the candidate. To join the LAS formally as a candidate member requires a simple majority vote of the regular members.
- 2.4. For a period of at least 2 years, candidate members must demonstrate active engagement with the LAS, such as (co-)organization of seminars and conferences, publications in line with LAS objectives and collaborative activities with other LAS members. Once the engagement has been verified, a 2/3 majority vote of the regular members of the LAS is required to promote a candidate member to the regular member category.
- 2.5. The maximum number of LAS regular members is 20. The maximum number of LAS regular members per country is 3. The maximum numbers should be reevaluated from time to time by a 2/3 majority vote of the regular members.

- 2.6. When necessary, LAS may call on expert consultants on specific topics, for specific periods of time, to support the development of activities.
- 2.7. Regular members who turn 70 years of age are no longer regular members, but can continue to participate in LAS activities and meetings as honorary members.
- 2.8. A regular member who does not participate in the LAS activities for three consecutive years or four alternate years will be permanently excluded from the LAS.
- 2.9. Any member may resign by resignation in writing, which shall be effective upon receipt by the President of LAS.

3. Other considerations

- 3.1. The officers of the LAS will be the President, the Secretary and the Treasurer. Officers are elected by a 2/3 majority vote of the regular members. Officers have a two-year term of office, with re-election permitted. Honorary members may apply to be President, Secretary or Treasurer, and if elected, they will have voting rights.
- 3.2. The LAS will inform the ICMSF about the activities it carries out, through an annual activity report and other communications.
- 3.3. The LAS has the right and power to raise funds and manage them independently.
- 3.4. Any publications made on behalf of the LAS must be pre-approved by consensus of regular members. ICMSF should be notified of these publications.
- 3.5. The LAS by-laws must be approved by a 2/3 majority of regular members and subsequently shared with the ICMSF Executive Board.
- 3.6. The activities of the LAS members are without remuneration. There are no dues payable by any category of LAS members.
